Who makes decisions about what issues?

Decisions that affect things like your education, healthcare and transport are made by different groups of people depending on where you live in the UK. The power to make some decisions is shared between the UK Parliament in London, the Scottish Parliament, the Assemblies in Northern Ireland and Wales, and some Mayors in England (**Devolved issues**). However, other decisions that affect all of the UK can only be made by the UK Parliament in London (**UK issues**).

- Mental Health – Devolved** Mental health services should be improved with young people's help; and should be available in schools.
- End Period Poverty – Devolved** Sanitary products are an essential item. The Government and the NHS should make them free and accessible for all who need it.
- Votes at 16 – UK** Give 16 and 17 year olds the right to vote in all elections/referendums.
- Put an end to Knife crime – Devolved** Too many young people's lives are lost to knife crime; the Government need to do more to help end the knife crime epidemic.
- A curriculum to prepare us for life – Devolved** Schools should cover topics like finance, sex and relationship education and politics.
- Support Youth Services – Devolved** Youth services help young people but in recent years they have been cut. Youth services need better financial support and security.
- Equal Pay for Equal work – Devolved** Give young people the same amount of pay, if they are doing the same work as adults in the same job.
- Let's tackle Homelessness – Devolved** Every person should have a place to live and the opportunity to live comfortably. Let's make it happen and put a stop to homelessness.
- Transport – Devolved** Make public transport cheaper, better and accessible for all.
- Welcome Refugees – UK** Everyone deserves the right to live without fear of death and persecution so we believe that refugees should be welcomed into communities in the UK.

The Home Office's #Knifefree campaign seeks to steer people away from knife crime by making them aware of the risks and highlighting positive alternatives to carrying a knife. Ahead of the new school year, the Home Office is issuing educational resources ([available here](#)) to support teachers and adults who work with children (for example, youth club leaders), to talk about the dangers of knife crime. There are two lesson plans – one for key stage 3 (for children aged 11 -14) and one for key stage 4 (for children aged 14 – 16) – alongside guidance to help teachers plan the lessons. The resources cover educating young people about the dangers of social media, the impact carrying a knife could have on their future, and how they can develop strategies to resist peer influence.

Awarded by Arts Council England the new Artsmark is a useful, practical and forward thinking tool. Re-designed by schools for schools in 2015, Artsmark will help you to embed arts and culture in your whole school improvement plan. It provides a framework and resources to assess current provision and to develop a plan of action to suit your own setting. It can provide evidence of how your school is meeting the social, moral, cultural and spiritual Ofsted requirements. Artsmark is open to primary, secondary and special schools, pupil referral units and youth offending teams.

This is your chance to learn more about the new Artsmark, meet colleagues from local schools, ask questions and find out more about what's on offer.

Rewarding Pupils' creativity and leadership

Arts Award is a series of five nationally recognised qualifications that supports anyone, aged 5 to 25, to develop their creativity, leadership and communication skills. It's a personalised learning framework which encourages young people to plan their learning and take the lead in activities and projects. Schools report that Arts Award has a positive impact on students' literacy, engagement and attendance. Arts Award can fit with arts activities you already provide and be embedded into the curriculum in all education settings. It provides you with a formal way to recognise and celebrate pupils' artistic and creative achievements.

PASH young people's peer education project is made up of young volunteers (aged 16-20 years) who deliver sexual health information and education to young people in Sheffield schools, colleges and other youth/ community settings. Once trained, volunteers get Involved in the following activities:

- Helping to run chlamydia and gonorrhoea screening stalls within a variety of young people's venues
- Delivering sexual health promotion sessions within young people's venues
