
Learn Sheffield Subject Networks 2018-19

The information on the following slides is an overview of the Subject Network programme.

It is designed to be shared with staff at relevant meetings in your school setting and contains information about the background to the programme, the networks on offer, booking places and quality assurance.

Learn Sheffield Subject Networks - Background

- The Sheffield Subject Specific Networks were re-launched two years ago.
- The network programme is included in the Learn Sheffield Subscription, so any subscribing school can send a colleague to any network without any additional charge.
- There is a cost for non-subscribing schools information about this is available on the website.
- The networks are, wherever possible, held in the same week so that schools and academies have the option of having a week each term when the staff team attend the networks across the city.

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The delivery of the networks is commissioned to teaching schools and specialist providers.

The programme is included within the Learn Sheffield Subscription or available at a cost to Learn Sheffield members (e.g. non-subscribing Sheffield schools - £40 per session / £400 full access) or non-members (e.g. non-Sheffield schools - £50 per session / £500 full access).


Some schools/academies (especially in primary where the majority of teachers are subject leaders) choose not to have staff meeting (or equivalent) in the week when most of the meetings take place – this is naturally a decision for the school leadership.


These are the subjects that are covered in the individual subject leaders network meetings.

Each school/academy has one place at each of these meetings but the places must be booked in advance.

Some of these networks are cross-phase (for example the EAL Network) but most are either primary or secondary.




We have listed the Secondary Assessment Network in the list of subject networks but it should be noted that there is a full Assessment and Moderation Training programme available for both primary and secondary.




Colleagues can follow the instructions on the next three slides to book a place at a network – it is a simple process!

- Click (or hover over) on Services To Schools
- Click on Subject Networks



The Subject Networks webpage (http://www.learnsheffield.co.uk/Services-To-Schools/Subject-Networks) contains a button for each term.

3. Choose the term you wish to view and the list of networks will appear underneath the button.



Once the term has been selected:

- 4. Select the network meeting by clicking 'Book Now'. This will take you though to the Eventbrite page.
- 5. Click 'Register' to book and fill out your details.

Some information (for example the venue of a network) will say 'TBC' initially – this will be updated as soon as we can confirm the information.

Some networks are currently not available for booking (e.g. the 'Book Now' button will be greyed out) – these will also be added shortly and colleagues should come back soon to book.

Learn Sheffield Subject Specific Networks - Quality Assurance

We hope that the programme of subject networks will support colleagues across the city to network with each other and make informed leadership decisions about their subject in their school.


- Learn Sheffield will collect feedback on the networks and make quality assurance visits during the year this informs decisions about how the networks are commissioned in the future.
