- The **Area SEND Inspection** report is expected to be published this month. There will be specific briefing sessions for school leaders once this is published and more information will follow in the next couple of weeks regarding dates and venues.

- You will have been contacted by the Inclusion Taskforce if there is a possibility that nobody from your school attended the **Graduated SEND Documents Training** last term. A 'mop up' session for schools which didn't manage to access the original sessions has been organised. The training is free to schools and is being led by citywide SENCOs attached to the Inclusion TaskForce. It includes guidance on the use of the new My Plan document and EHCP processes and it is very important that all schools have attended.
