- We have been reviewing information on school website in relation to the Equalities Act, as part of a piece of work with Sheffield City Council to support our wider work on the equalities agenda. This review has now been completed and we will be in touch with all schools over the next few weeks. As always with this kind of review activity our findings may not always be accurate and there will be occasions when we haven't found a document that is online but I hope that the information that we provide will be helpful.
- The 2019 Team UK trials for the <u>Invictus Games</u> (to be held in The Hague in 2020) are being held in Sheffield (22-26 July) this summer. We are working with the organisers to develop the offer to Sheffield schools – both in the run up to the event and during the week itself (which crosses the end of the summer term for most schools). Look out for information later this half term.
- Finally Learn Sheffield (in partnership with Create Sheffield and Cohesion Sheffield) are working with the organisers of the fantastic Festival of Debate to develop some opportunities for teachers look out for the emails once the programme has been launched later this month.
