



### Sheffield Subject Specific Networks for 2016/7


The meetings will be held every second half-term over the year and the majority of the spring term meetings are in the week beginning 6th March 2017.



Whilst the course is not a replacement for the two day Youth

MHFA course, delegates will become Champions for better health in schools.

### On the course you will learn:


- What is mental health and mental ill health?

### Young Carers Governor Training: Best practice for identifying and supporting pupils with caring responsibilities

1 in every 12 young people are taking on mid- to high-level care for a family member (BBC 2010). This means there are over 7,000 school age young carers in Sheffield. Many young carers go unidentified, however, and experience significant educational, physical, social and emotional impacts as a direct result of their caring role. Early identification of young carers is vital to help minimise these impacts.

This engaging, interactive workshop will help Governors understand the issues that affect young carers and how schools can improve their outcomes by:

Gaining an understanding of the reasons why children and young people are caring, the types of care they provide, the indictors of being a young carer, and the impacts this can have on them

Finding out about recent changes in legislation and local policy affecting young carers

Getting information on best practice and free resources for identifying and supporting young carers in your school

### Young Carers Strategic Board – Schools Representative Opportunity

We are looking for a representative from Sheffield schools to sit on the city's multi-agency strategic Young Carers Education, Attainment and Employment operational subgroup.

The group reports to the Carers and Young Carers Strategic Board and works to put the city's Adult, Parent and Young Carers Strategy 2016-2020 in action.

# PE Pledge for Sheffield Primary Schools

- Physical Education, healthy lifestyles, sport and the emotional wellbeing of our children is a priority for our school and is included in our school improvement plan
- Our school provides 2 hours of Physical Education per pupil per week within the curriculum and promotes outdoor learning
- At least one hour of Physical Education within the curriculum is led by a qualified teacher
- Physical activity is embedded in school life ensuring all children have an opportunity to engage with at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity each day
- Our school is committed to working with partners to ensure all children learn to swim at least 25m before they leave primary school
- Our school encourages healthy eating through messages to children and parents and school meal provision

- All children in our school have the opportunity to participate in intra/inter school competition
- Our school engages with the national School Games programme of competition
- Our school is using PE and Sport Premium funding to develop teacher confidence and competence by working with external partners such as School Sport Partnerships, Youth Sport Trust etc.
- PE is led by a subject coordinator who is supported to engage with external partners to develop high quality PE and school sport provision.
- Our children receive PE lessons which are monitored in line with other curriculum area
- Our PE and sport offer is inclusive and engages all pupils including the least active and those with disabilities

### ESCAL Sheffield – Reciprocal Reading EEF Trial for Primary Schools 2017/18



ESCAL has been approached by FFT Literacy to share the Reciprocal Reading Trial opportunity with Sheffield schools.

Please find information below about the Literacy Trial in Reciprocal Reading which the EEF is funding for academic year 2017-18. This trial will include a total of 100 schools.

To summarise the Reciprocal Reading trial (2017-18):

All interested schools must be prepared to be randomised to deliver the programme or to act as a control and continue with business as usual for one year, after which they too can deliver the programme.

Eligible schools randomised to deliver the programme must be able to do so with year 4 (whole class), 5 and 6 (targeted) pupils. Intervention schools will pay £500 to receive the intervention (All training and school support) and receive £200 worth of books (this is a fraction of the cost of the programme and takes into account the fact that we are testing the impact of the programme). Year 4, 5, and 6 pupils will complete tests (GL New Group Reading Test).

Control schools will receive £1000 in recognition of completing the GL Assessment New Group Reading Test with their pupils in Y4, 5 and 6 and any other assessments required by the evaluators, and agrees **not** to engage in the programme until the end of the trial.

To be eligible schools must **not** have engaged in Reciprocal Reading training from FFT Literacy in the past. Schools who take part in this study should not be in the middle of another EEF literacy trial with KS2 pupils. Other than that, everyone interested is welcome to register, particularly if their FSM level is above average.


