PE Pledge for Sheffield Primary Schools

- Physical Education, healthy lifestyles, sport and the emotional wellbeing of our children is a priority for our school and is included in our school improvement plan
- Our school provides 2 hours of Physical Education per pupil per week within the curriculum and promotes outdoor learning
- At least one hour of Physical Education within the curriculum is led by a qualified teacher
- Physical activity is embedded in school life ensuring all children have an opportunity to engage with at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity each day
- Our school is committed to working with partners to ensure all children learn to swim at least 25m before they leave primary school
- Our school encourages healthy eating through messages to children and parents and school meal provision

- All children in our school have the opportunity to participate in intra/inter school competition
- Our school engages with the national School Games programme of competition
- Our school is using PE and Sport Premium funding to develop teacher confidence and competence by working with external partners such as School Sport Partnerships, Youth Sport Trust etc
- PE is led by a subject coordinator who is supported to engage with external partners to develop high quality PE and school sport provision
- Our children receive PE lessons which are monitored in line with other curriculum areas
- Our PE and sport offer is inclusive and engages all pupils including the least active and those with disabilities



Barnardo's Positive Identities Service works to raise awareness around sexual identities and gender identities, and prevent discrimination and prejudice. We support young people who identify as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual Trans and Questioning (LGBTQ) and work to tackle Homophobic, Biphobic and Transphobic (HBT) discrimination and bullying, striving for a more equal society in which everyone feels able to be proud of and celebrate who they are.

We have had a fantastic response to our primary and secondary school recruitment surveys for the Department for Education and Government Equalities Office funded **Anti-Homophobic, Biphobic, Transphobic bullying programme 2016-2019**. The work is **funded and free** to primary and secondary schools and is a fantastic opportunity to create a sustainable, embedded culture of promoting equality and inclusion, celebrating diversity and of effective anti-discriminatory practice. The programme aims to up skill school staff to ensure they have the confidence, knowledge and skills to effectively support children and young people around sexual and gender identities and to positively challenge discrimination and prejudice.



Following a discussion with the Government Equalities Office, it has been agreed we can extend the offer of the Programme so that primary and secondary schools in Yorkshire and Humber region who have not had the opportunity to complete the survey can do so. We were able to share with the Office the feedback that we have received from schools and local authority leads about timescales to complete the recruitment survey as well as the need for the work and therefore we have now **extended our deadline for completed surveys to Wednesday 25th January 2016.**

This is to ensure all schools have the opportunity to be included for recruitment: this is a fantastic project and we would like to ensure we are engaging with all schools across the region.

026 P4C Trial 📥

(Deadline: 27 January 2017)

Learn Sheffield would like to advertise an EEF-funded NFER national P4C trial on behalf of our colleagues at DECSY (Development Education Centre South Yorkshire). Schools will be randomly allocated to either 'intervention schools' or 'control schools'. Intervention schools will have all KS1 and KS2 teachers trained in P4C and supported by SAPERE trainers to develop P4C as a whole school teaching approach over 3 years leading to the P4C Gold Award. Control schools will not use P4C materials until Sept 2019, will provide data of Y4 pupils and administer questionnaires to those pupils in spring 2017 and 2019. Control schools will then choose to either receive the intervention or a financial incentive of £5,700.
