The Move More Schools Challenge looks a little different this year. It will not be using any tracking technology, but will instead look to engage pupils, staff, and parents. It will involve the following areas:

1. **A Move More Launch event** – Every school signed up will be asked to print a Plaque (see below) and at 12:30pm (lunchtime) on Wednesday 6th June get everyone in the whole school doing the action on the plaque for one minute – then everyone can tweet about it and post up a picture #MMSchools

3. **A teachers Pledge** that will ask teachers to sign a pledge to get their pupils more active through using active lessons, and actively encouraging them to be active at break and lunch times

2. **A Move More Playground Challenge** – Move More Plaques can be printed and laminated by schools and put around the playground, encouraging pupils to be more active at break and lunch time, as well as a resource for teachers for classroom active breaks

4. **A parents infographic** that will encompass why our kids need to be active, as well as a call to action, asking family's to do something active for Move More at least once a week through June.
