The Launch of Sheffield's Year of Reading



Sheffield's Year of Reading launches across the city on 15th January 2020 and will be a 12-month, citywide celebration of creativity and the written word.

Reading is the key that unlocks the door - it helps us feel better, discover more, and unleashes our individual creativity.

The Year of Reading aim will inspire us all about what reading can do for every one of us and the huge benefits that it brings to our everyday lives; how a story can take you to a faraway place in your head, imaginary or otherwise, or how reading a technical manual can help you build something amazing that you've never built before. How reading an auto-biography can help inspire you to change your plans or fill you with admiration, or how a Sci-Fi read can help you escape you into mysterious and fantastic worlds.

Based on four themes: 'Only Human, Rebellion', 'Exploration' and 'Creation', the year will involve anyone who wants to be a part of it across the city. Everyone's invited and everyone's welcome.

To get us into the reading spirit, the launch will be set in the Central Library and libraries around the city, with many school children taking part in workshops with authors and Illustrators. Also launching will be 'Sheffield's Favourite Reads'; a citywide conversation about the books everyone loves. There will be an exhibition in the Central Library, which will include the personal recommendations of numerous Sheffielders, including some well-known faces. Each person will highlight their favourite book and what it means to them.

From launch day onwards, there is the opportunity for all individuals from across the city to share us what their favourite read is and they will be in with a chance of winning a £100 book token if they take part. It doesn't matter what kind of book it is, as long as it's someone's favourite. They will need to fill in a Year of Reading postcard in their library or tell us online before 31 March.







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Unsticking Stuck Schools

and The First Findings from the EIF EvaluationWith Daniel Muijs

Daniel Muijs is Deputy Director with responsibility for Ofsted's research and evaluation programme. His role includes oversight of Ofsted's new multi-year research programme across all phases of education and social care, which consists of over 25 projects over two years.

He leads a team of 35 researchers and evaluators as well as inspectors working on research projects temporarily. He is responsible for ensuring the 2019 Education Inspection Framework is informed by the best possible evidence from research and academia, and has been charged with ensuring that Ofsted's research is of a similar quality to that of leading research teams internationally. Daniel is a visiting professor at the University of Southampton.

- Ofsted's research on stuck schools, which compared schools that have been less than good for at least 13 years with matched schools which have improved from RI or inadequate to good, and the further work Ofsted are doing on unsticking stuck schools.
- The first findings from the evaluation of the Education Inspection Framework, which was introduced in September 2019.

This project set out to do data differently. Discussions about data in schools are usually linked to pupil attainment, data are represented using charts and graphs, and teachers rarely initiate data collection themselves or use it for their own purposes.

Inspired by Dear Data, a creative postcard exchange by two information designers, this project explored how data might be used in creative, imaginative and personalised ways to explore primary teachers' everyday experiences of literacy teaching.

Seven primary teachers chose aspects of literacy teaching that were important to them, collected data on those aspects, found ways of representing those data on postcards and discussed these at half-termly meetings. Their postcards provide insights into aspects of literacy teaching that are significant to them. They also raise questions about what might happen - to teachers and to teaching - if the use of data in schools started to look and feel rather different.

STAYVVELL THISWINTER

As you will know, schools offer the perfect breeding ground for many common winter infections. These infections then spread rapidly, causing disruption to pupils, staff and parents. If antibiotics are taken inappropriately, harmful bacteria can become resistant and stop medicine working when really needed.

We all need to use antibiotics appropriately so that they continue to work properly. Schools, children and teachers are particularly important in the fight against antimicrobial resistance (AMR).

Resources for Winter Wellness

There are some simple actions that you can take to minimise disruption and help keep your pupils and staff healthy, with a range of resources available as follows.

1. Keep Hands Clean

Good hand hygiene will reduce the risk of illnesses spreading. Alcohol hand gel can be used if necessary, but should <u>not</u> replace washing hands if hands are visibly soiled or when there are diarrhoea and vomiting cases in the school.

She has worked with head teachers and senior leaders on various programmes nationally, providing practical school to school support resulting in rapid change and school improvement. Much of this work has been through programmes to further develop practice and approaches to SEND. Maria has also worked in an advisory role for the Department of Education to reform National Professional Qualifications for School Leadership and Career Progression for Teachers, and is currently a panel member supporting the development of an evidence based SEND Guidance Report on behalf of the Education Endowment Foundation.
