Create Sheffield (the name for Sheffield's Cultural and Education Partnership) is a not-for profit company formed to ensure that all children and young people in Sheffield can experience and participate in high quality arts, creative, cultural and place-base. We are seeking an energetic and experienced professional to drive forward the Cultural Education Challenge across Sheffield. The post holder will play a key role in bringing together educational and cultural organisations in the city to ensure that all children and young people from Sheffield's many diverse communities are able to benefit from the rich cultural education offer on their doorstep.

Create Sheffield has been successful in securing significant funding from Arts Council England through its Partnership Investment Fund to support ongoing strategic development over the next three years. The Programme Manager, working closely with the Directors of Create Sheffield, will be responsible for delivery of the proposed strategic work as part of this funding.

The ideal candidate will be a passionate and credible advocate for the power of the arts in education. We seek someone with recent experience of working in education or the cultural sector who will be able to demonstrate knowledge of issues currently facing schools and learning settings. Possessing excellent interpersonal skills, the successful candidate will have a proven track record of partnership working and managing arts development and/or educational programmes, and effectively connecting and communicating within professional networks.

The post is a fixed-term three-year contract with the option to review at the end of year 1, subject to funding.

Job Description

Purposes of Post

The post holder will manage, coordinate and drive the work of Create Sheffield.

The post holder will coordinate the rich cultural offer available in the city for all learners aged 0-24. The aim is that all children and young people will have access to high quality cultural education.

The post holder will be responsible for the effective delivery of the Partnership Investment Programme funded by Arts Council England.

Main Areas of Responsibility

The post holder will:

- work with the board to lead and drive the development of Create Sheffield as a new organisation, supporting the board in developing its strategy, policies, organisational development and delivery, so that it can deliver on its ambition
- advise the board on operational matters including financial management
- develop and deliver a communications strategy, ensuring that partners and stakeholders are kept informed and are able to appropriately influence the development of Create Sheffield
- manage the development and delivery of Create Sheffield's key priorities and projects, including Create Sheffield's initial priorities, 'Sheffield Adventures' and 'The City of Young Makers'
- ensure all activities have synergy with other educational initiatives driven by Create Sheffield
 and align to wider strategies for children and young people alongside the cultural priorities of
 the city
- facilitate creative collaboration between partners and all educational settings in the local area to support the development and delivery of high quality, inclusive learning opportunities designed to give all learners the opportunity to:
 - create, compose and perform
 - visit, experience and participate
 - know, understand and review
- enable a higher level of engagement with the Sheffield cultural offer for children and young people currently not accessing cultural education
- deliver improved value for money through partnership working, including the pooling of resources
- support the implementation of strategic interventions such as Artsmark and Arts Award
- assist cultural organisations in promoting their existing offer to children and young people (including events), highlighting opportunities for them to bring the curriculum to life and for children to learn through and about culture.
- support nurseries, schools, colleges and cultural organisations in celebrating children and young people's cultural achievements to a wide audience
- support the development of curriculum resources based on local culture; to train staff in the use of the resources and support them to embed culture into the whole curriculum
- consult with young people about their creative and cultural aspirations and work with partners
 to develop new opportunities to broaden the expectations and experiences of those young
 people, creating visible pathways and progression routes into the creative and cultural
 industries.
- assist in the research, evaluation, monitoring and dissemination of the programme to a local, regional, national and international audience
- act as an advocate for the role of the arts in education and the place of creativity in education and lifelong learning locally, regionally and nationally
- explore avenues of funding for schools and settings to support children and young people's cultural development
- liaise and network with partners in similar roles within the city region
- Evaluate and reporting on activities, developments and progress on a quarterly basis to the board.
